The 2019 **Connecticut Legislative Session starts on Wednesday, January 9**. Take a moment to consider the following questions. Would you like a script and fact sheet emailed to you so you know exactly what to say to your State Senator and State Representative on issues? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then you should consider joining the CTUCC Advocate Corps!

During this legislative session, the CTUCC Advocate Corps might work on issues, such as the minimum wage, paid family medical leave, access to original birth records by adult adoptees, hydraulic fracking waste, gun safety, mass incarceration, quality affordable healthcare and opposing casino expansion in Connecticut.
