
Unit 2: "Jonah and the Fish"

Overview:

- Jonah wants to avoid offering the Ninevites a chance to escape destruction, so he flees on a ship.
- God sends a storm, but Jonah would rather drown so he gets thrown overboard.
- God sends a large fish (whale perhaps?) to swallow him and spit him on land.
- Jonah finally goes to Nineveh.
