

## Looking Ahead - Our Thanksgiving Offering

For a number of years now, First Church's annual Thanksgiving offering has supported two wonderful programs that reach out to persons in need – the **Bloomfield Backpack Project** and **Back Bay Mission** of Biloxi, Mississippi. Our generous dollars have reached "the poorest of the poor" who are served by the United Church of Christ mission agency on the Gulf coast, and children in nearby Bloomfield for whom a backpack of food over the weekend can make them better students on Monday morning!

On September 21 our church council voted to affirm the recommendation of the Board of Christian Service that our Thanksgiving offering once again include a donation to each of these two vital mission partners. In addition, the Board of Christian Service recommended that the needs of **Syrian refugees** also should be the recipient of our Christian love. The council overwhelmingly endorsed this recommendation!

In order not to dilute our annual giving to Back Bay Mission and to the Bloomfield Backpack Project, **a goal was set for \$6,000 for our Thanksgiving offering**, so that we might generously support all three worthy causes.

Your **Thanksgiving offering contribution** can be sent to the church office at any time, or simply put in the offering plate on Sunday mornings, with checks made out to *"First Church"* with the memo line, *"Thanksgiving offering."* 

Meanwhile, we are still receiving **gifts for the desperate need of the refugees in the Middle East and Europe**. Those designated gifts can be made with a check to *"First Church"* with the memo line, *"Syrian crisis."* 

The time is now for First Church to arise with its compassionate and caring heart to reach out with God's love to children in need both near and far!




Answer: A. The estimated median income for a Glastonbury household is \$101,076. For a family with that household income, a 3% pledge would amount to a \$3,032 yearly pledge (or \$58.00 a week).
