Our Meetinghouse Chrismon Tree

Chrismon is Latin for "Christ monogram". Chrismons are unique symbols that represent various aspects of Jesus' life and ministry. Over 50 years ago, in a small Lutheran Church in Virginia, the idea of decorating the Christmas tree in their house of worship with symbols of Christ to give the tree special meaning was born. The idea quickly spread to other churches. Many different materials have been used to design the symbols over the years. Ours are counted cross stitched in blue, gold and red with gold trim. Information identifying the various symbols is available near the tree. We pray that it will enhance your worship experience during this Holy Season.

Board of Christian Service: Benefits Covenant to Care, Family Life Education and MACC The Board of Christian Service will benefit three different organizations. The first is **Covenant to Care**. Our liaison from First Church works with social workers at the Manchester Department of Social Services to assist families who find themselves in a time of crisis or transition.

The second beneficiary is **Family Life Education**, which is located in the Parkville neighborhood of Hartford and is dedicated to building a stronger community by engaging and strengthening families through youth development and support and family services. We are adopting two families and helping with various needs.



The third organization is **Manchester Area Conference of Churches**, which provides food, clothing, outreach and advocacy services for the unmet basic needs in the community.

Volunteer at Mobile Foodshare or Help Deliver Food to Shelters & Soup Kitchens

Mobile Foodshare is a "farmer's market" style food distribution service that provides fresh produce and other food items to between 90 and 150 lower income people. Foodshare sponsors this service, and it takes place every other Wednesday in our back parking lot (*December 9 and 23*). Besides distributing food to needy people in our parking lot twice a month, our volunteers collect food from ShopRite in East Hartford, bringing 500 to 1,000 lbs of meat, produce, baked goods and groceries weekly to shelters and soup kitchens in Hartford.
