#### Dear Friends,

Yesterday afternoon I was enjoying some conversation time with my daughter, Meg, and I was telling her that <u>after</u> yesterday morning's worship service I saw at least one car drive up after an immediate trip to a store, the occupant quickly hopping out to drop off a bag of hats, socks and mittens for kindergarteners in Hartford.

Meg, the executive director of a non-profit, after-school program of tutoring and athletics called *Capitol Squash*, observed,

"Oh, we are making sure that our 4th and 5th graders have warm coats - some do not."

As we move in the church year from the season of *Epiphany* to the season of *Lent*, and as the unseasonably warm days inevitably turn to more normal cold days, *let us never, ever forget* that there are children in this state who are cold, and children in this state who are hungry. *Totally unacceptable*. While responding to the immediate need for clothes and food, let us also, as a family of faith, set ourselves to doing what we possibly can to explore the systemic and root causes of this injustice. I look forward to doing that with you in the coming months.



I ended yesterday's sermon with this benediction:

Friends, from my office window overlooking our back parking lot, with all the coming and goings of the people of this beloved family of faith, day after day, week after week, month after month, I see winner after winner after winner -I get to see the winners that make up this congregation!

And the winner is... someone pulling up to the back lobby door to drop off size 5 or 6 mittens, socks, hats and gloves; or canned goods for Hartford and Manchester food pantries...



And the winner is... someone directing traffic or distributing food off of the mobile Foodshare truck...

And the winner is someone carpooling into Hartford to read, tutor and mentor at the Fred Wish School...

And last night I saw <u>27</u> winners get off a plane at Bradley Airport after a week at Back Bay Mission sharing God's love in Biloxi, Mississippi...

And in April our senior high youth will be **winners** as they travel to Washington, DC for their mission trip, and a college-aged member visits orphaned children in Nepal...

And at coffee hour in just a few minutes, some of you will be winners as you support the **Hands on Hartford** lunch, sign-up for a mission immersion day, buy

a special card to support the **Children's Wellness Center**, or consider volunteering to read at **Fred Wish School**, or attend a meeting to organize our sponsorship of a refugee family...and someone will be a **winner** simply because they paused for a moment to give a person a hug or to hold the door for the next person...

This beloved family of faith is <u>filled</u> to <u>overflowing</u> with winners – <u>filled to overflowing</u> with <u>winners</u> who <u>sing</u>, <u>ring</u>, <u>teach</u>, <u>advise</u>, <u>visit</u>, <u>care</u>, <u>knit</u>, <u>organize</u>, <u>give</u> and <u>serve</u>!

And the winner is....God's amazing love!!

And let the people say, Amen!






## Women's Theological Reflection Group






# Adult Opportunities Prayer and Share



• experience being a good neighbor.







## **Gloves for Foodshare Participants**




