The Board of Christian Service is sponsoring a sock collection for a foot clinic that will be held at Church Street Eats (A Manna Program) at Christ Church Cathedral Hartford on *Wednesday, March 23*. Many of the clients who attend Church Street Eats are in need of someone to care for the health of their feet. This population is at risk for poor foot health.

The intention is to educate the attendees on proper foot care showing them how to prevent or look for signs of infection, bathe feet, inspect feet for the beginning of wounds, check pedal pulses, file toenails, apply Aquaphor lotion, provide clean white cotton socks, and refer clients for treatment, if need be, to a wound care center in Hartford. There will be a basket for the white cotton socks in the back lobby.
