## **Refugee Resettlement Update**

First Church's planning to host a refugee family is continuing on multiple fronts. First, the Committee is excited to announce that our \$6,000 funding goal has been reached and exceeded, thanks to First Church's generous supporters. Meanwhile, volunteers are being organized into ten groups (housing, furnishings, healthcare, ESOL, employment, etc.) according to areas of interest.

Great progress has been made in collecting and temporarily storing furnishings for the refugees' apartment. Special thanks go to First Church members and friends for the donations, and to the Committee volunteers and Good Samaritans who turned out in droves recently to move almost an entire apartment's furnishings on a cold, rainy late Friday afternoon. By early June, the Committee expects to complete planning and give the "Green Light" to let IRIS know we're ready to take in a family. 


# BROWN BAG LUNCHES

evening. We plan to repeat the dinner and auction again next year. The 5th annual event is scheduled for May 20, 2017. Save the date!



Karen Dugan assisted in the meal preparation. Ruth Miller was a key helper in the cleanup during and after the dinner.




# Adult Opportunities 👔 🕻 Thursday Morning Study Group

## **Biography Book Group**






## Mobile Foodshare

Mobile Foodshare is a "farmer's market" style food distribution service that provides fresh produce and other food items to between 90 and 150 lower income people.
