

Al Abas Family Update

Since First Church began hosting the Al Abas family of Syrian refugees last July, the family has happily embraced life in Glastonbury. The five children, ages 8 through 19 are all doing well in the town's schools, mother, Ezdehar, a great cook, is developing a career in cooking/catering, and Walid and Mohammad are helping with expenses working part-time at Max Amore.

The family loves Glastonbury but now fears they may not be able to stay here with Zeyad, the father, unable to find full-time employment. In Syria, Zeyad worked in construction, including operating a business constructing formwork for concrete foundations. His experience includes carpentry and painting. Zeyad's English is improving but not yet fluent. He will soon have a driver's license. The Next Street Driving School generously donated Safe Driving classroom instruction that Zeyad needs to obtain his driver's license. Once Zeyad has his license, he can use the car generously donated for transportation. Until then, Zeyad can get to work with help from First Church volunteers.

Our refugee volunteers have been assisting with the job search, but we're hoping to find some good leads from the wider First Church community. Foodshare Volunteer Opportunity - We Need You!

Hunger is an invisible problem, so most people are unaware of how large a problem it is. In Hartford and Tolland counties alone, the area served by Foodshare, there are 137,000 people who cannot be sure where their next meal is coming from. The majority of these 137,000 people are either children or seniors, and the majority of the rest are working full-time jobs (or two). Foodshare's vision is for a community where all of these people can get all of the food they need. And as the region's food bank, they work toward that vision by getting food donations from the food industry and distributing them to 300 food pantries, community kitchens, homeless shelters and other partner programs.



Here at First Church, we have the Mobile Foodshare truck come to our back parking lot every other Wednesday. Now we have a new opportunity to go to the Foodshare Regional Market in Hartford on alternating Wednesday mornings (April 5 and 19) from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. to help sort and package the produce so it all

Mobile Foodshare

Mobile Foodshare is a "farmer's market" style food distribution service that provides fresh produce and other food items to between 90 and 150 lower income people. Foodshare sponsors this service, and it takes place **every other Wednesday (April 12 and 26)** in our back parking lot. 



Church School Unit 7: "Symbols of Holy Week"

Bible Story References: Matthew 21:1-17, 26-27; Mark 11:1-11, 14-15; Luke 19:28-40, 22-23; John 12:12-19, 13-19

Bible Verse: Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing. (Luke 23:34a)

Main Idea: Using symbols can help double children's learning potential as they engage different areas of the brain by both seeing and hearing Bible stories. The symbols used to tell the story of Holy Week will help children comprehend and tell others the story of the last days of Jesus' life.

Objectives: Children will use the symbols of Holy Week to:

- Learn the events of Holy Week;
- Recognize the stories related to the events of Holy Week;
- Create a way to share the story of Holy Week with others through symbols;
- Review the four Gospel accounts of Holy Week and compare the symbols used.




Second Sunday Book Club




Prayer and Share




Calling Knitters and Crocheters!
