



\$1,500 = a catchment system for clean water



Are You Ready for Camp at Silver Lake?!?!





Book Signing and Presentation by Gordon Bates




On **January 29 at 3:00 p.m. in Schultz Hall**, Gordon Bates, our Minister of Visitation, will speak about his recently releaased book. Published by Wesleyan University Press, Gordon draws upon his three decades of work with the Connecticut Prison Association (CPA) to describe the evolution of the police, courts and prisons in Connecticut. The CPA is a private, non-profit agency that was formed in 1875 and is still going strong under the name of Community Partners in Action. The title of Gordon's history is *The Connecticut Prison Association and The Search for Reformatory Justice*, which covers the years between 1875 and 2000. A separate coffee table book, with the text also written by Gordon, will be published in a few months with photographs that trace the CPA story into the 21st century.

Gordon began research on the agency's influence on Connecticut's criminal justice system in 2004 after retiring from his position as Minister of Justice

for the Connecticut Conference of the United Church of Christ. The CPA story is told within a national perspective that puts Connecticut's system in its larger context. Copies of Gordon's book will be available at the event or they are now available in most bookstores.

A reception will be provided for those who attend and Gordon will gladly sign copies for those who desire that personal touch.





The Biography Book Group meets every other month to review a book and enjoy fellowship in an informal setting. We invite you to join us for any of our upcoming selections. The March biography selection is *Turner: The Extraordinary Life and Momentous Times of J.M.W. Turner* by Franny Moyle. We hope you will enjoy reading about this British artist whose visionary work set the stage for a revolution in landscape painting. "Over the course of his lifetime, Turner strove to liberate painting from an antiquated system of patronage. Bringing a new level of expression and color to his canvases, he paved the way for the modern artist. Turner was very much a man of his changing era. In his lifetime, he saw Britain ravaged by Napoleonic wars, revived by the Industrial Revolution, and embarked upon a new moment of Imperial glory with the ascendancy of Queen Victoria. His own

life embodied astonishing transformation. Born the son of a barber in Covent Garden, he was buried amid pomp and ceremony in St. Paul's Cathedral" (Amazon.com). We will meet on **Tuesday, March 14 at 4:00 p.m. in the Lehman Library** to enjoy a discussion of this artist and biography. "Marion and Shiva Stone are twin brothers born of a secret union between a beautiful Indian nun and a brash British surgeon. 
Potpourri
