Micah House and Chapel Update: February 2018

The holiday season is now a memory, having celebrated the birth of Jesus Christ as a welcoming, diverse and inclusive congregation. We are now deep into a traditional New England winter with freezing temperatures, cold winds and lots of snow. Yet the warmth next door moves us forward towards the birth of The Micah House and Chapel at The Thomas Hale Homestead!!

George Fay, the project's contractor, and his team have completed the rebuilding of the exterior of the Hale House and the exterior shell of the new Micah Chapel. In January 2018, the construction highlights are:

- High R-value insulation system was installed from attic to basement;
- Heating system became operational; and
- Sheet rock was installed and taped.

Once these items are completed, the construction team will begin installing the flooring and trim.



Just as a reminder, for safety's sake, please don't talk to the contractors as they work on the Micah House and Chapel. Everyone is excited and curious about the construction but distracting a contractor from their work is a potential safety hazard! Please direct all questions to Jonathan Russell, Mick Gifford or Walt Briggs who continues to provide handson financial and construction oversight. Estimates of sweat-equity cost savings to date exceed \$60,000!!

Whether it is the prophets in the Old Testament or Jesus and the Apostle Paul in the New Testament, our call is clear. It is our responsibility to be generous, to serve and to share God's love with others.

We are blessed to be part of a congregation that takes that call seriously. One way we share God's love is by giving to people who are in need.

Thank you to all of you who have also generously responded to the Famine and Hurricane Relief appeals. \$8,064 was donated for East Africa Famine Relief, and \$8,108.85 was given in response to the Hurricane Relief appeal.


Andrew Wicks, a First Church member and former Director of Children and Youth Ministries, is a life-long Silver Laker. We asked him to share a few words with us.

Church School Mission Project Opening Doors and Building Bridges: One Preschooler at a Time



What if you could help end both hunger AND obesity for families right next door in the city of Hartford? What if you could help preschoolers learn how to grow vegetables or how to cook a healthy meal? *Little City Sprouts* is a Farm to Preschool program of Hartford Food Systems, providing preschool children with the opportunity to know about, grow and taste fresh, healthy food through food-related field trips,

gardening, nutrition and cooking lessons designed for them. The program encourages preschoolers across the city of Hartford to get excited about adopting healthy lifestyles.

The program began in April 2015 and was developed after a study conducted in Hartford in 2012 found that a shocking 37% of preschool children were overweight or obese. Little City Sprouts encourages healthy nutrition habits at a young age, as these habits will shape child development and continue into adulthood. First Church's support will help Little City Sprouts expand their reach and broaden their efforts to impact the lives of many more Hartford "sprouts" and their families! 

Thursday Morning Study Group




Second Sunday Book Club

Reiki is effective, powerful and efficient, yet safe, gentle and natural. It helps to promote health, healing, happiness, wholeness and well-being on the emotional, mental, spiritual and physical levels. Reiki can reduce stress and pain, restore vitality and speed the healing process.

Library Corner Book Review:


Prepare for Surgery, Heal Faster, by Peggy Huddleston

If the prospect of upcoming surgery makes you anxious, Peggy Huddleston's book, *Prepare for Surgery, Heal Faster*, is a great resource. It provides medically proven mind-body techniques that allow patients to feel calmer, to use less pain medication when recovering and to heal more quickly. There's also a chapter for parents on helping children prepare for surgery, and a list of affirming statements that you can ask your operating room staff to say as you're going under and coming out of anesthesia. Borrow a copy of this book and CD combo a week or more prior to your surgery. Listen to the CD at least four or five times to learn the relaxation techniques and to visualize the healing process, and listen to it after surgery to help control pain and to speed the healing process.

As noted on the CD cover, "This CD can also be used for general relaxation as it never mentions surgery. Use it to lessen stress, stop tension headaches and migraines, fall asleep if you have insomnia, lower blood pressure, and lessen chemotherapy side-effects." Both the book and CD are in our Lehman Library located on the second floor. If you borrow a copy, please sign the book and CD out and place the card in the metal box on the rear shelf. Women's Theological Reflection Group


