Micah House and Chapel Update June 2017

Many of us search our entire lives for a miracle...well search no more. The renovation of the Hale House is a miracle happening right now at First Church!! Take a moment and look outside when you are visiting church or attending Sunday worship service. Even better – view the First Church live webcam and watch the progress every day towards our dream of revitalizing the historic Thomas Hale Homestead into the Micah House and Chapel. Alleluia!!



Since April 3, 2017, George Fay has been the project's contractor. The building has been lifted, the chimney stabilized, and the dirt dug out for the new foundation. The next phase is to pour the new foundation's concrete and let it settle. The house will then be

lowered onto the new foundation and George Fay can begin the next phase of renewal and construction.

Church members Jonathan Russell, Mick Gifford and Walt Briggs continue to provide hands-on financial and construction oversight throughout the project. Members of the Building Committee and many others continue to save money by providing hands-on interior and exterior demolition of parts of the Hale House.

Special care is being given to preserve anything that is reusable. Estimates of sweat-equity cost savings to date exceed \$40,000.

The Micah House and Chapel at the Thomas Hale Homestead is God's miracle and will be a legacy that serves First Church today and for future generations!!

First Church is a place where we are constantly serving our neighbors in need. It is our call and our privilege to spread God's love in our church community, in Glastonbury, in Hartford, in other Connecticut towns and cities, throughout our nation and all around the world.

Foodshare Volunteer Opportunity – We Need You!

Hunger is an invisible problem, so most people are unaware of how large a problem it is. In Hartford and Tolland counties alone, the area served by Foodshare, there are 137,000 people who cannot be sure where their next meal is coming from. The majority of these 137,000 people are either children or seniors, and the majority of the rest are working full-time jobs (or two). Foodshare's vision is for a community where all of these people can get all of the food they need. And as the region's food bank, they work toward that vision by getting food donations from the food industry and distributing them to 300 food pantries, community kitchens, homeless shelters and other partner programs.

FOODSHARE Here at First Church, we have the Mobile Foodshare truck come to our back parking lot every other Wednesday. On the employment front, father Zeyad is interested in developing a painting business, and has done a number of projects recently for First Church clients. Thanks to all who have had him paint! Ezdehar, with help from Refugee Committee members and her family, has been delighting church members and friends with her monthly Syrian dinners in Schultz Hall, which have been selling out quickly. The next one will be held in July. She has also catered dinners in several First Church members' homes and her long term goal is to have a food truck. Volunteers have been helping Ezdehar understand the many requirements for setting up a food business. Walid and Mohammad work part-time at Stop & Shop and Max Amore, while Majd has been doing yard work for First Church folks in his spare time, and plans to work full-time at the Killam and Besette farm in South Glastonbury this summer. Both Majd and Sedra have made honor roll at Glastonbury High School and Smith School, respectively, and first grader Sara continues to do very well in Buttonball School, as we hear from her teacher. Zeyad has been working hard honing his driving skills in hopes of passing the DMV road test and getting his license, which will be a big step in gaining independence for the family.

You are Invited to a Homemade Syrian Dinner and Cultural Experience!



Mobile Foodshare is a "farmer's market" style food distribution service that provides fresh produce and other food items to between 90 and 150 lower income people. Foodshare sponsors this service, and it takes place every other Wednesday (June 7 and 21) in our back parking lot. 






Silver Lake this Summer!

Choir Camp, August 20-23


