Well, it is finally springtime, and with the beginning of the baseball season the words of Yogi Berra still ring true, "It's like déjà vu all over again."



## Micah House and Chapel Update May 2017

The renovation of the Hale House is progressing on schedule – just take a moment and look when you are visiting church or attending Sunday worship service. The progress over the past month has been nothing short of amazing – our dream of revitalizing the historic Thomas Hale Homestead into the Micah House and Chapel is coming true with every passing day. Alleluia!!



A full building permit has been issued for the project, and the building was handed over to contractor George Fay on April 3, 2017. The building has been lifted and we are now working to stabilize the chimney and create the new foundation. The house will be lowered onto the new foundation and George Fay can begin the next phase of renewal and construction.

Church members Jonathan Russell, Mick Gifford and Walt Briggs continue to provide hands-on financial and construction oversight throughout the project. Members of the Building Committee and many others continue to save money by providing hands-on interior and exterior demolition of parts of the Hale House. Special care is being given to preserve anything that is reusable. Estimates of sweat-equity cost savings to date exceed \$40,000.




### Congratulations!

## Foodshare Volunteer Opportunity - We Need You!

Hunger is an invisible problem, so most people are unaware of how large a problem it is. In Hartford and Tolland counties alone, the area served by Foodshare, there are 137,000 people who cannot be sure where their next meal is coming from. The majority of these 137,000 people are either children or seniors, and the majority of the rest are working full-time jobs (or two). Foodshare's vision is for a community where all of these people can get all of the food they need. And as the region's food bank, they work toward that vision by getting food donations from the food industry and distributing them to 300 food pantries, community kitchens, homeless shelters and other partner programs.



Here at First Church, we have the Mobile Foodshare truck come to our back parking lot every other Wednesday. Now we have a new opportunity to go to the Foodshare Regional Market in Hartford on alternating Wednesday mornings (May 3, 17 and 31) from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. to help sort and package the produce so it all

Mobile Foodshare is a "farmer's market" style food distribution service that provides fresh produce and other food items to between 90 and 150 lower income people. Foodshare sponsors this service, and it takes place **every other Wednesday (May 10 and 24)** in our back parking lot. ## Diaper Drive for Covenant to Care for Children

The Board of Christian Service is sponsoring a diaper drive during May. Many babies lack a sufficient supply of disposable diapers to remain clean, dry and healthy. Did you know that there are 5.9 million babies in the U.S. aged three or younger who are living in poor or low-income families and that disposable diapers cost up to \$150

per month per baby? Without transportation, buying diapers at a convenience store rather than a large discount store can double or triple the monthly cost. People can buy candy with food stamps/SNAP, but diapers are classified with cigarettes, alcohol and pet food as disallowed purchases.

For the month of May, we will be collecting donations of diapers of all sizes and brands in a collection box in the back lobby. Our social workers at Covenant to Care for Children say the need is desperate. Thanks to all for your generous gifts and caring hearts!







## Church School Unit 8: "How the Bible Came to Be"

Bible Story References: 2 Kings 22:8-23:3

**Bible Verse:** Joshua 1:8; Isaiah 40:8; Psalm 119:105; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Hebrews 4:12

Main Idea: The Bible, written by many different people over a long period of time, has been preserved and translated into many languages so it is now available to people around the world.

**Objectives**: In this unit children will learn:

- The books of the Bible were written over a long period by people of different backgrounds.
- The decision of what books go into the Old and New Testaments, the canon, was made many years ago. These books have been accepted by Christians as inspired by God.
- The Old Testament is the "Bible" that Jesus knew and quoted.
- The New Testament contains the story of Jesus, his disciples, and the beginning of the Christian church.
- All of the Bible, both Old and New Testaments, helps us know how God acts in relationship to people and to know how we should relate to God.
- We need to know what the Bible says and apply it to our daily lives.




## Bloomfield Backpack Project



## Thursday Morning Study Group: Art and More!



April 27 – We will meet in the church parking lot, and depart by 9:35 a.m. in carpools and make a field trip to the studio barn of Julie Schnatz Rybeck. Julie will show us her work, and describe the process by which she does her wonderfully creative work! 




## Second Sunday Book Club




## Prayer Shawl Ministry and Knit in Public Day!


