Dear Friends,

In a September sermon, we told the story of the Houston police officer who lost his life in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey. As Sergeant Perez set off to do his job early that August Sunday morning, his final words to his wife were, "We've got work to do."



Truer words could not be spoken in these challenging and tragic times as people of faith attempt to respond to the seemingly endless headlines about hurricanes, fires, earthquakes, monsoons and famines. Indifference and apathy are not an option.

Likewise, the tragic mass shooting in Las Vegas has left so many people asking the same question – over and over again – *What can we do? What can we do?* We look forward to exploring with you what people of faith can actually do to try and weaken the stranglehold that guns have on our society – and to lessen the number of people, so many of them children, who needlessly die because of our nation's obsession with guns.

Meanwhile, with all the divisiveness in our nation, with all the war and violence in our nation and around the world, and

with natural disasters overwhelming areas both at home and abroad, it would be easy to lose hope. But we would rather think that it is precisely the time to roll up our sleeves and to do the work that God calls us to do.

And one way that we can respond to some of our nation's and our world's recent tragedies is through our various special offerings which share our love – God's love – with people who are in need. For instance, if you gave to this year's Easter offering, which includes a generous gift from this family of faith to *One Great Hour of Sharing*, you are already showing love to the people

of Puerto Rico and Texas, and you are also showing love to refugees in the Middle East.





Grants from the United Church of Christ disaster relief fund, supported by our *OGHS* offering, have already been sent to these areas of immense need both here at home and around the world. Our partner churches are administering these funds to help people with food, shelter and safety.

We can support and show our love to the storm-tossed and war-ravaged people of the world by giving generously to the network of churches in those areas that are sharing our love with those in need. And we do this through *OGHS*. In addition, our upcoming Thanksgiving (please see the enclosed letter about this year's offering) and Christmas offerings (which will be given to *HELO Haiti*, *Glastonbury Fuel Bank*, *Manchester Area Conference of Churches*, *Hands on Hartford*, *and the Horace Bushnell Children's Food*

Pantry) will also be sharing our gifts and our love with the people both near and far!

We have also said recently that as people of faith we are perhaps being called *to live more simply, to give more generously, and of course, to love always!* Throughout the year, with our gifts to First Church's special offerings at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter, we are proclaiming, "We have work to do!"

Micah House and Chapel Update: November 2017

Thanksgiving is upon us – a traditional time when families, friends and strangers gather together to thank God for the many blessings in our lives. At First Church, we give thanks by celebrating the ongoing "work" of opening the doors of our hearts and love for one another and by building inclusive bridges that reflect the diversity found in the world today.

The Micah House and Chapel at The Thomas Hale Homestead is our congregation's "work" that continues to amaze visitors, friends and congregation members!! George Fay, the project's contractor, and his team have nearly completed the rebuilding of the exterior of the Hale House and the exterior shell of the new Micah Chapel. Here are some of the construction highlights:

- Installation of a new foundation for the Hale House and Micah Chapel
- Completion of the exterior framing and roofs for the Hale House and Micah Chapel
- Installation of windows, siding and exterior trim
- Restoration of the exterior chimney
- Restoration of the three first floor fireplace hearths
- Installation of rough framing for the interior partitions and stairs

The project is making a concerted effort to reclaim all materials from the Hale House in this project. For example, beautiful chestnut planks from the original exterior and interior sheathing for the house were salvaged and delivered to a local saw mill to be replaned (a process used to flatten, reduce the thickness and give a smooth surface to a rough piece of lumber) for the new chapel floor. All the fieldstone used for the original foundation has been sorted and will be used for various stone walls in the final landscaping. Also, where practical the contractor will reinstall all the trim, wall panels and doors from the Hale House, which are currently being stored in a trailer on site.







Over the next months, the construction team will install a new fire sprinkler, heating and cooling duct work, electrical and plumbing systems and insulation for the building. Once these items are installed, the finishing touches, sheet rock, trim and painting, will be initiated.

Just as a reminder, for safety's sake, please don't talk to the contractors as they work on the Micah House and Chapel. Everyone is excited and curious about the construction but distracting contractors from their work is a potential safety hazard! Please direct all questions to Jonathan Russell, Mick Gifford or Walt Briggs, who continue to provide handson financial and construction oversight. Estimates of sweat-equity cost savings to date exceed \$60,000. People are asking – how can I help? Please contact Jonathan Russell at cjjc5@cox.net to learn of volunteer opportunities.

The Micah House and Chapel at the Thomas Hale Homestead is God's miracle and will be a legacy that serves First Church today and for future generations!!

Bible Story References: Matthew 1:18-24, Luke 1:2-56, Luke 2:1-7 **Bible Verses:** For nothing will be impossible with God. (Luke 1:37)



The 2017-2018 Church School Mission Project Opening Doors and Building Bridges: One Preschooler at a Time



What if you could help end both hunger AND obesity for families right next door in the city of Hartford? What if you could help preschoolers learn how to grow vegetables or how to cook a healthy meal? *Little City Sprouts* is a Farm to Preschool program of Hartford Food Systems, providing preschool children with the opportunity to know about, grow and taste fresh, healthy food through food-related field trips,

gardening, nutrition and cooking lessons designed for them. The program encourages preschoolers across the city of Hartford to get excited about adopting healthy lifestyles.

The program began in April 2015 and was developed after a study conducted in Hartford in 2012 found that a shocking 37% of preschool children were overweight or obese. *Little City Sprouts* encourages healthy nutrition habits at a young age, as these habits will shape child development and continue into adulthood. First Church's support will help *Little City Sprouts* expand their reach and broaden their efforts to impact the lives of many more Hartford "sprouts" and their families! Thank you for donating to this important Church School Mission Project!

- \$25 exposes 250 children to a new fruit or vegetable (like yellow squash!)
- \$200 provides 1000 copies of home educational materials (English & Spanish)

Until recently, the taping was done first by Jim Jackson alone, then later Paul Giguere joined the team. But throughout this process, Jim Jackson has been our sole editor of the services to prepare them for broadcast by Cox. Thank you, Jim, for your faithful service! This ministry was committed to reaching shut-ins, the elderly, potential new members and the general public.

But throughout this wonderful ministry, we have had no way of knowing the breadth of its outreach. We are aware, however, of the hours and hours of volunteer effort that have been needed to put into this work. Moreover, our Media Committee has begun the exploratory work of possible other, albeit computer-based, means of transmitting our service to church members and to the community, i.e., livestream, a YouTube channel, Facebook.

Therefore, we have made the difficult, but we believe prudent, decision to cease the broadcasting of our services on Cox Cable. Our sermons can still be heard on podcasts by visiting our website. We look forward, at some time in the future, to announcing some new ways to view and experience our worship of God here at First Church. Meanwhile, the in-person, "live" participation in our Sunday morning worship is probably still the best way to experience the beautiful love of God in this beloved community!



Dear Friends,

As we move through this beautiful autumn season, we have become so aware of our world's unrelenting natural disasters, as well as the difficult circumstances in which many people daily live – be it in a nearby Connecticut community or a refugee camp across the oceans.

We are reminded of these words of 20th century Jewish theologian, Abraham Heschel,

A religious person is one who holds God and humanity in one thought at one time, at all times, who suffers harm done to others, whose greatest passion is compassion, whose greatest strength is love and the defiance of despair.

Each year, First Church defies the world's despair – both near and far – by exhibiting its great strength of love through the support of our Thanksgiving offering which supports four worthy efforts.

The *Bloomfield Backpack Project* was started by Eunice Medwinter, a member of First Congregational Church of Bloomfield, when she saw a need. Eunice wanted to do her part to make sure the children in Bloomfield had enough to eat over the weekends, and so she contacted Foodshare and started the Bloomfield Backpack Project. Eunice began in 2009 and, since then, our church has helped financially and continues to send teams of volunteers to pack the backpacks once a month.





Back Bay Mission has been a lasting source of hope and help for thousands of children, adults and families along the Mississippi Gulf Coast since 1922. For nearly 100 years, Back Bay Mission has provided innovative solutions

and compassionate responses to those suffering at the hands of social injustice and economic hardship. One of its most recent endeavors was the construction of housing for veterans. Our church has been working with Back Bay Mission for 13 years. This past year our senior high youth fellowship traveled to BBM for their annual mission trip.



Integrated Refugee and Immigrant Services, a New Haven-based agency, with whom we have resettled refugees in the past, is leading the effort to help settle Syrian refugees here in Connecticut, including the Al Abas family. Church member and Glastonbury resident Chris George is the executive director of IRIS.





The United Church of Christ "*Emergency USA Fund*" has been established to provide relief and emergency aid to the people and communities devastated by all of the recent domestic storms. These

funds will provide necessary support to those communities as they clean up and rebuild, and as volunteer mission teams travel to



the area to help in this restoration effort.

As each of us seeks to hold God and suffering humanity in one thought at all times, please help us reach our goal of \$8,000. *Please*
