# Below is an excerpt from David Taylor's Homecoming Sunday sermon, "Opening Doors and Building Bridges!"

Well friends, *it is Friday*, and in this beloved family of faith, we are bodies broken by cancer and disease, addiction and old age; we have broken hearts, broken families, broken minds, broken hopes and dreams, broken spirits...*but Sunday's comin'*.

*It's Friday*, and in this richest of all the nations, 1 in 5 children live in poverty without adequate food, health care, home or education...*but Sunday's comin'*.

*It's Friday*, and in this nation, we still see torch carrying white supremacists, neo-Nazis and members of the KKK espousing words of hatred, bigotry, homophobia, and anti-Semitism – yelling words like, "Jews will not replace us!"...*but Sunday's comin'*.

It's Friday, and every 3 days, another 20 children under the age of 18 die from gun violence; that's every 3 days, another Newtown because of our nation's obsession with guns...but Sunday's comin'.

*It's Friday* because there are far too many states which still have no anti-discrimination laws to protect our gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender sisters and brothers...*but Sunday's comin'*.

*It's Friday*, when God's amazingly beautiful yet oh-so fragile creation is threatened by the truly catastrophic effects of global warming, and the "fake news/hoax" attitude of climate change deniers threaten the very



existence of this planet and threaten the lives of our children and grandchildren...**but Sunday's comin'**.

And it's Friday when we retreat from our nation's inspiring heritage of welcoming the immigrant, the refugee, and the dreamers who bring such richness to this melting pot of a nation – and who have truly made America great – again and again and again and again!...but Sunday's comin'!

Well, I have news for you – Sunday isn't **comin'** – Sunday is **here**! So, look out world, for **we** are here – **First Church** is here!

Friends, out in the world it may be Friday, and far too often it is Friday in our own lives and in the lives of our fellow First Church members, but Sunday is here – and this is **our** day!

This is **our** day to say that every child of God is welcome to this place of peace and grace – this place where <u>all</u> are

safe to sing or laugh or shed a tear!

This is *our* day to open our hearts, open our doors, and in the coming year to dream of and to build some *new* and

even more beautiful and perhaps even life-saving bridges to one another and to God's children who are in need!

And so, let us go forth from this place to build bridges of hope and understanding, bridges of peace and justice, bridges of inclusion, compassion and love!

### Process for Elizabeth's Ordination

Dear Friends,

In our denomination, the United Church of Christ, there is an understanding that all members are called by their baptism to ministry, while some are set apart for authorization for ordained ministry. Elizabeth has been on the journey toward ordination for a number of years. Born and raised in Minnesota, where she graduated from the College of St. Benedict, Elizabeth immediately matriculated to Yale Divinity School and earned her Masters of Divinity in 2015. Recently Elizabeth wrote her ordination paper and defended it before the members of the New Haven Association Committee on Ministry, since her home church is the Church of the Redeemer in New Haven.

On **October 8 at 3:00 p.m. at the Church of the Redeemer**, Elizabeth will appear before an Ecclesiastical Council, which is a gathering of lay delegates and clergy from the New Haven Association. At this meeting, Elizabeth will share her faith journey and then answer questions about her beliefs and theology. Members of First Church are welcome to attend this Ecclesiastical Council.

Upon successful completion of this approval process with the New Haven Association, First Church's Council will vote to call for a congregational meeting, at which time the congregation would consider offering Elizabeth an official "call" to become an ordained minister on staff here. It is our hope and expectation that Elizabeth would be ordained into Christian ministry, here at First Church, sometime in the first half of 2018.

This is an exciting journey, and we are grateful to be walking it with Elizabeth!



# Opening Doors and Building Bridges!

As members of the First Church family of faith, we have many ways to truly make a difference in the lives of God's children who are in need — both near and far! Throughout the 2017-2018 church year, with our generous gifts to One Great Hour of Sharing, to various special appeals, and to our Church School's annual mission project, we can truly live out the words of the prophet Micah "to do justice and to love kindness!"



### Little City Sprouts

This year, our Church School mission project will benefit "*Little City Sprouts*," a farm to preschool program of Hartford Food System. This innovative program provides preschool children with the opportunity to know about, grow and taste fresh healthy food through food-related field trips, gardening, nutrition, and cooking lessons designed for them. The program aims to encourage preschoolers across the Hartford to get excited about adopting healthy lifestyles and eating patterns.

The program was developed after a 2012 study conducted in Hartford found that a shocking 37% of preschool children were overweight or obese. Little City Sprouts encourages healthy nutrition habits at a young age as these habits will shape child development and continue into adulthood.

All year long you can support our children's mission project by making a gift to Little City Sprouts through First Church. You can make a gift to honor someone's birthday or a special holiday, or in memory of a loved one – and an acknowledgment card makes a great "stocking stuffer" at Christmas! ### Special Appeal for Hurricane Recovery Work

The news from the devastation of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma continues to unfold in tragic ways. As members of the United Church of Christ we have always been committed to providing immediate support to the hardest hit parts of the world through natural and human-caused disasters. We are committed to long-term relief efforts, and by filling gaps in services through the following provisions: spiritual care, community organizing, repair and reconstruction of homes, tools, building materials and volunteer coordination.



UCC Disaster Ministries is already gearing up for our long-term recovery work and your contributions means providing community support for holistic recovery, repairing house and home for families and children.

### Special Appeal for the Famine in East Africa

A concerted global effort continues to reach out to millions who are at risk of severe malnutrition and starvation in four famine-stricken areas of East Africa – Somalia, South Sudan, Nigeria and Yemen. To date, United Church of Christ Disaster Ministries has forwarded \$140,000 for mobile clinics, therapeutic feeding and medicines, food, nutrition supplements, safe water, sanitation, fast-maturing seeds, farming tools and support to keep pupils and teachers in school in South Sudan and drought-stricken Somalia, Ethiopia and Kenya.

More than twenty million people face starvation. International aid officials have stated that this is one of the biggest humanitarian disasters since World War II.

Increased investment in international humanitarian assistance is critical to assist these people in crisis. In addition, we see that continued funding for peacebuilding programs that prevent violent conflict are critical pieces that help address root causes of poverty and famine.

# Opportunities to Volunteer with Foodshare!

Foodshare's vision is for a community where all people can get the food they need. As the region's food bank they work toward that vision by getting food donations from the food industry and distributing them to 300 food pantries, community kitchens, homeless shelters and other partner programs.

There are **three ways to get involved** with Foodshare here at First Church.

- 1. Volunteer when the Mobile Foodshare truck comes to our back parking lot every other Wednesday morning at 10:00 a.m. This is a "farmer's market" style food distribution of fresh produce and other foods, and it takes many volunteers to serve everyone who comes. If you are interested in participating (adults, youth and children are welcome!), contact Sally Riddell at 860-657-8715.
- 2. Volunteer at Foodshare's Regional Market in Hartford on alternating Wednesday mornings to help sort and package the produce that gets given out on the Mobile Foodshare truck at various sites across the state. 
### First Church's Good Samaritans

On Saturday, November 11, we are looking for individuals and families (children are welcome) to volunteer at various sites that serve






### Wednesday, November 15: Walther Grunder's Experiences in WWII
