



### The Al Abas Family is Settling In

After a 32-hour trip from Jordan to Germany to New York, the Al Abas family of seven has been busy getting acclimated to the United States and to Glastonbury. In addition to Zeyad and Ezdehar (dad and mom), the family includes boys Walid, Mohammad, and Majd (ages 19, 18 and 15), and girls Sedra and Sara (13 and 7).

This delightful family is very appreciative of the help they've been given, and eager to learn English and become assimilated into our culture. We've rented a comfortable house for the family on Hubbard Street near the town green. During the month since they arrived, they've been busy getting their Social Security cards, enrolling in state and federal benefit programs, attending three days of training at IRIS in New Haven, taking almost daily English lessons from First Church tutors, and enrolling in three of our Glastonbury schools. They've enjoyed attending weekly prayer services at the mosque in Windsor. You might see the boys riding their bikes around town, or along the riverfront with their new fishing poles. The Al Abases have been welcomed in a get-together by their friendly neighbors and recently attended a performance of *The Little Mermaid* at the high school.



The critical next step is to find employment for the four oldest in the family. Zeyad has experience in building construction, including owning his own firm. Ezdehar loves to bake, and is quite good at it, and could work in the earlier part of the day before the kids are home from school. The older boys have experience in food service, but in the future, Walid and Mohammad would like to become a civil engineer and commercial pilot, respectively.

The activity outlined above has been made possible by countless hours and days spent by First Church's team of volunteers dedicated to God's work of welcoming a family in need. A big THANK YOU to all who are contributing to this united effort, with their time, talents and donations!



### **Church School Unit 1:** "Burning Bush & Other Images of God"

**Bible Story Reference:** Exodus 3:1-5, 13-14a; 13:21-22; 19:3-6; Psalms 18:1-2, 27:1; 62:1-2; Revelation 22:5

**Bible Verses:** "God created humankind in his image...God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good" (Genesis 1:27, 31a).

Main Idea: Who is God? What is God like? Throughout history people have expressed the reality of God through images and metaphor. Children will explore some of the many images of God in the Bible and discover how those images can help us know God.

#### **Objectives**:

Children will have an opportunity to

- enlarge their understanding of God through exposure to new images of God;
- explore a variety of images of God in the Bible -- fire, rock, eagle and light;
- explore the idea that the image of God can be revealed through them and their actions.

### The 2016-2017 Church School Mission Project Building the Beloved Community: One School at a Time

What do you expect to find at your children's school building? A roof? Classrooms? Bathrooms? Clean water flowing from faucets? Drinking fountains? Teachers? We would never dream of sending our children to a school without a solid building structure, plumbing and electricity. But this is the reality for many students worldwide, including in East Africa.

Schools are the bedrock of a community's health, well-being and future. They are a centering point and a place to learn and commune for the greater good. Yet the challenges that impoverished schools face can be steep. When a community struggles with limited access to clean water and sustainable food sources, it is often reflected in the school buildings. A vibrant learning environment requires infrastructure, supplies and dedicated teachers.

Each year our Church School partners with a non-profit to help provide vital funding for programs serving the neediest among us. This year's Church School Mission Project is School Safe Zones through Church World Service. Through the School Safe Zones program, we will be helping to revitalize a school in East Africa. Our goal is raise \$10,000 for this special project. Here are just a few examples of how we can help!



100 = a bunk bedin the dormitory

\$600 = a latrine for improved sanitation



\$1,500 = a catchment system for clean water

### **3rd Grade Bible Recognition**




